Just over two years after the passing of the first UN Security Council Resolution on Youth, Peace and Security and the growing recognition of the centrality of young people to our collective peace and security, this Progress Study has made very clear how and in what ways young people have and will continue to contribute to preventing violence and consolidating peace. The evidence captured by the Progress Study far predates UNSCR 2250. Therefore, it is incumbent upon all stakeholders, including civil society actors to (1) explore what the recommendations mean to CSOs and (2) find ways to translate them into meaningful action nationally, regionally and internationally.

On the heels of the second Open Debate on Youth, Peace and Security hosted by the Government of Peru (the first being convened by the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan entitled: The Role of Youth in Countering Violent Extremism and Promoting Peace) and in the midst of the first High-Level discussions on Sustaining Peace, this event and others like it challenges champions within the international community to turn words into thoughtful, sustainable and strategic action. Therefore, this roundtable discussion will focus on civil society organizations and their networks- from grassroots to global.

Guiding Questions: The following are illustrative questions that will guide our discussion.

### Advocacy:

- In what ways can civil society organisations advocate member states to invest 1.8 billion by 2025? Through what specific channels? What works? What doesn't?
- How might CSOs help to bring together champions in different government ministries, from justice and defence to health, economic and youth, to listen and engage in supporting the needs, rights and contributions of young people in decision-making and policy shaping?
- How can CSOs at the global level galvanize support and momentum for the Youth, Peace and Security agenda?

# Capacity-building:

- In what ways can CSOs support youth groups and movements in strengthening their capacities to be more effective in contributing to our shared youth, peace and security agenda?
- How can we enable and support youth-led interventions in building and sustaining peace?

# Program design:

- What commitments can civil society make to ensure that young people participate in the design, implementation and monitoring and evaluation of programming?
- How can CSOs collaborate with other stakeholders to strengthen programme quality?

#### Gender:

 How can norms and benchmarks applied to CSOs working in the women, peace and security inform the youth, peace and security efforts?

#### Awareness-raising and space:

- How can civil society better connect UNSCR 2250 to local contexts?
- How do we scale these efforts?
- How can civil society organizations and networks create and sustain the safe spaces for young people to organize?
